The 160-mile cross-state trail would:

- enhance Indiana as a recreational tourism destination,
- provide a unique way to explore Historic National Road corridor,
- facilitate economic development opportunities,
- encourage active lifestyles and provide more quality-of-life options across the state, and
- enhance sense of community with intimate pace of trail travel.


